## Job search sites

Have a username and password ready and make sure you have recorded it somewhere for easy retrieval. An email address is also required so that notifications about new job vacancies that match your criteria can be received. Complete the questions to ensure the job advertisements that are sent to you are relevant to your skills and interests.
